(Temporary Footpath Closures) Order 2018

To protect public safety whilst a bridge awaits repair, East Sussex County Council have made an Order under Sections 14(1) and 15(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, which will temporarily close the following footpaths

Temporary Footpath Closures

The whole of **Public Footpaths Hailsham 34a, Herstmonceux 67 and Hailsham 34b** will be closed between TQ 6110 1104 and TQ 6137 0967. No alternative route is available.

The Order is made following the issuing of a Temporary Notice under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Act 1984, as amended.

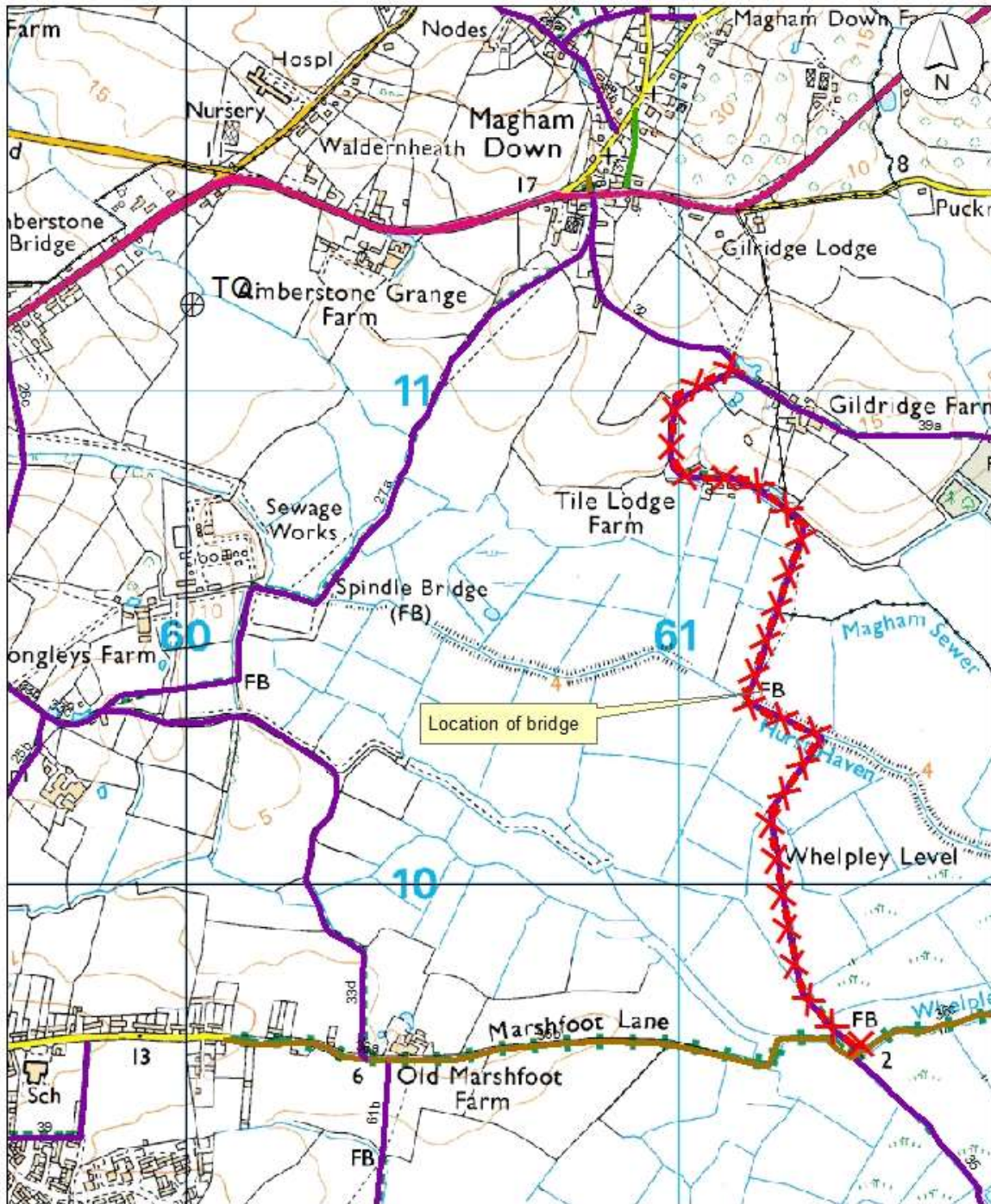
The closure will be in force for 6 months from 29 October 2018, or until the works are completed, whichever is the earlier, which after this period will require an extension from the Secretary of State, should the footpaths still be unfit to use.
