

Van and Commercial Vehicle Rules at Household Waste Recycling Sites

The Household Waste Recycling Sites are for the deposit of household waste only. The following rules are in place to help ensure that commercial waste is not deposited at the sites.

Conditions of Entry

Vans will be permitted on specific days only (published on Veolia & Council websites).

Only household waste will be accepted.

No commercial or trade waste.

Van drivers must provide proof of address. This needs to be two forms of ID, for example drivers licence, recent utility bill or council tax bill.

All vans must have a maximum gross vehicle weight of less than 3500 kg.

Exclusions

The following vehicle types are not permitted:

- luton body with or without tail lift
- flat bed
- tipper body
- cage body
- sign written vans containing matching waste types
- removal vans
- vehicles from Van & Man services

Enforcement

We will record information of all site users using a van or commercial vehicle for monitoring and enforcement purposes. Please see overleaf for our GDPR Privacy Notice for more information on this.

Waste from business and commercial or trade activities cannot be deposited at Household Waste Recycling Sites and persons found doing so are liable to enforcement action being taken against them. Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and other related legislation, the maximum penalty is a fine of up to £50,000 and up to 12 months imprisonment in the magistrates' court, or five years imprisonment and an unlimited fine at the crown court.

Van and Commercial Vehicle Privacy Notice

What information do we collect from you?

In order to facilitate your visit to our Household Waste Recycling Site, we collect the following information about you;

- Vehicle Registration Number
- Driver's Name and Address
- Company name from vehicle livery
- Waste type and quantity
- Date and time of your visit

Why do we collect this information?

This information is required for enforcement purposes, to ensure that you are not using our site to illegally dispose of commercial waste.

Who might we share your information with?

This information will be collected by a member of Veolia staff, and will be shared with East Sussex County Council and/or Brighton and Hove City Council.

We will never share your personal information with any other third parties, unless reasonably required by law.

How long do we keep hold of your information?

We will keep this information for a maximum period of 12 months.

How can I access the information you hold about me?

You have the right to ask us for your personal information that we hold and process about you. This is known as a subject access request.
